Course Outline

- the postpartum follow up meeting
- challenging clientele
- self-care for doulas
- the basics of setting up your doula practice and getting yourself out there
- discerning which models of practice work for you
- working with success in mind

About MotherWit

What is MotherWit?

The word "motherwit" refers to the concept of a body-mind centred knowing (intuition) based upon common sense (what effectively serves in the here and now). MotherWit holistic doula training strives to connect students to what emerges from their own motherwit within the context of solid, foundational knowledge. Students are guided to provide the same empowering approach with their clients, serving as a missing link in modern maternity care, and thriving as they do so.

Who is MotherWit Doula Training?

MotherWit is a training organization and certifying body dedicated to serving the educational and support needs of doulas and health care providers. Our trainings include CORE and advanced birth doula skills certification programs, postpartum doula training and certification, as well as soft skills for medical professionals workshops.

MotherWit is based in Montreal. Quebec, Canada, and has trained doulas across North America.

MotherWit was founded by Lesley Everest, who has been active in the field of childbirth education, birth attending, and postpartum support for most of her adult life. Lesley has been a holistic doula for over twenty years and has been training doulas for over ten years.

A mother of four children, a former accredited La Leche League Leader, and a trained Lactation Educator, Lesley trained as a birth doula with what is now known as toLabor (in 1993).

Lesley draws upon her training and experience in Kinetic Swedish. Ayurvedic, Thai Yoga Massage and is certified in Pre- and Perinatal Massage Therapy by Carol Osborne. Lesley is also a Certified Polarity Practitioner, a Shamanic Reiki Master Practitioner and is professionally trained in Psychosynthesis Psychotherapy.

As an ordained interspiritual minister through One Spirit Interfaith/Interspiritual Seminary, Lesley officiates non-religious ceremonies of celebration and transition. She provides counseling and support to all those seeking a deeper connection to their own inner wisdom..

A trained hospice volunteer, Lesley provides comfort measures, emotional support, and spiritual care to the dying and their families. As a cancer survivor, Lesley has skill, experience, and sensitivity in supporting those in emotional/physical/spiritual crisis.

Certification Requirements

Please read carefully: the requirements do **NOT** need to be done prior to the training:

- TWO (2) business oriented assignments (will be given during the CORE workshop)

- Attend a hospital or clinic based childbirth education class. If this option is
 not available to you, you may take the <u>BabyCenter</u> online course. The point of
 this requirement is to understand what most people are being taught about birth.
 You are responsible for the cost of this class. Documentation is required as
 proof of your attendance, as well as a 250- 500 word essay comparing and
 contrasting this approach to client education you have learned in doula training
- CPR Standard CPR/AED Level C
- Attend a series of 4 La Leche League meetings (one meeting per month over 4 consecutive months), OR 4 meetings with a local breastfeeding education/support organization
- Breastfeeding essentials course
 - http://step2education.com/es01-breastfeeding-essentials.html If you have already completed any WHO/UNICEF approved breastfeeding training within the last five years or if you are already a breastfeeding educator, or a current La Leche League Leader or equivalent, etc. you are exempt, but must provide supporting documentation. You are responsible for any costs.

• Attend FOUR (4) births,

- provide a write-up of how the prenatal meetings, birth, postpartum meeting/s unfolded, providing insights, concerns, questions and personal recognition of areas of strength/need for development
- AND an evaluation from one of the parents
- AND one of the attending Health Care Provider (doctor,nurse,midwife).
 Evaluation forms will be available online.

Shadowing an experienced doula for at least one of your three certifying births is HIGHLY recommended wherever possible. The apprentice/mentor relationship provides the richest of learning opportunities. Single Birth Apprenticeships are available from MotherWit Mentors in certain cities for an additional cost.

- A research project on a topic relevant to doulas, approved by the trainer, being
 either: a research paper of a minimum of 1000 words, citing at least four
 resources OR a video OR an in person presentation/demonstration of about 15
 minutes long. (examples: a presentation/explanation of herbs you've tinctured, or
 lecture/demonstration regarding relaxation meditation for labour coping)
- **FINAL EXAM!** When **ALL** the above requirements are met, you will be given a final online open book exam. Your readiness to qualify as as MotherWit Certified Holistic Birth Doula will be evaluated, and if you have completed everything satisfactorily, you will receive your certificate.

After completing the CORE workshop you have **ONE** year to complete your birth doula certification. If you do not finish within one year from the date you completed your initial training workshop, you will be charged a \$100 fee at the time you do certify. If you do not certify within three years from the date you completed your training workshop, you must take the workshop again if you wish to certify.

Continuing education is important to updating and expanding your professional skills as a doula. We recommend that you attain 6-10 hours of CEU's or CERP's annually.

Cost

- The cost of the training is \$750 plus applicable taxes. (which INCLUDES the
 workshop, the training manual, first year MotherWit membership, certification and
 mentorship during the certification process BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE other
 required reading material, extra required childbirth ed class and breastfeeding
 class, or potential apprenticeship.
- The cost of yearly MotherWit Membership is \$50. This is required to maintain certification status, membership in our MotherWit student and alumni resource group and receive 10% discounts on all MotherWit trainings. You will be billed on the anniversary of the first day of your training workshop and have 30 days to pay.
- Half of the fee (\$375 plus applicable taxes) is due within TWO WEEKS of acceptance into the workshop UNLESS you apply and are accepted less than one month prior to the start date of the workshop, in which case the deposit is due immediately. If you must withdraw from the training more than 3 weeks before the start date you will receive a full refund minus a \$100 fee,
- The remainder of the fee is due three weeks before the date of the training. If you withdraw after this point there will be NO refunds **UNLESS** the class is cancelled. If you must withdraw from the training after full payment for whatever reason, you **CAN** apply this fee to a future training.
- If special payment plans are arranged, payment must be made on the agreed upon dates, otherwise your place in class cannot be held, and your previous payments will not be refunded.
